

**THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
SHERWOOD IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT**

August 10, 2021

The regular meeting of the Sherwood Improvement District was held on Tuesday, August 10, 2021, at 6910 SW Fountaindale Road, Topeka, Kansas. Board members present were George Schuler, Rick Nesbitt and Doug Mays.

Also attending were Deputy Michael McNulty (Reserves Division of the Shawnee County Sheriff's Office), Kevin Holland (Cook, Flatt & Strobel Engineers, PA), Steve Dodd (Sherwood Lake Club), Jim Crowl (Shawnee County Counselor) and Cathy Mosimann.

George Schuler called the meeting to order.

Deputy McNulty spoke about garage doors continuing to be up and speeding within the district. He said lights are a deterrent. The car that has been parked on Worwick Town Road has been moved. Rick Nesbitt stated that the patrol cars are welcome to park in his driveway.

Rick Nesbitt moved to approve the minutes of the July 2021 board meeting. The motion was seconded and carried.

**Old Business:**

Kevin reported the following information:

- Bettis is done patching and the road work is to begin next week
- Drainage projects are to start the week of Labor Day
- Doug sent Kevin pictures about certain road problems. They are on the Bettis list.
- One new street sign has been ordered – Royal & Imperial

George reported that the Lake Club board says the Improvement District can put a piece in the Sherwood Scene. They believe it is a quarterly publication.

The land the Improvement District mows between Urish and 41<sup>st</sup> streets is unusable. There was discussion about a quitclaim on the property.

**New Business:**

Discussion occurred about whether parking an inoperable RV or auto could be added to the Nuisance Ordinance. Jim Crowl said he would look into it for the board.

There was follow up discussion on ARPA funds. There is confusion at the state level and waiting on the legislative process is needed. Kevin is to get the information ready and submit the projects that need to be done on the roads.

The budget worksheets were reviewed for 2022 with a decision to go ahead with a revenue neutral rate hearing and a budget hearing next month, which set the total mill levy at 8.831. The RNR is 8.897.

There being no further business, Rick Nesbitt moved to adjourn. The motion was seconded and carried.
